REMEMBERING NAOMI KAMINSKY

CC@ H Co-Founder and Past President Naomi Kaminsky died peacefully at home in the arms of her family on August 11 after a brief illness. Joan Urban (Co-Founder) and Fran Pitlick (Past Vice-President) offer their thoughts below.

From Joan: Many of you have heard Naomi and me speak about the origins of Chevy Chase At Home. Fellow dog walkers for years, Naomi and I discovered during the fall of 2008 — when everything seemed possible — that we harbored a similar dream of creating an aging in place village. We had even saved identical articles from the national press about the pioneering Beacon Hill Village in Boston. We began to talk up the "Village idea" among neighbors but quickly realized the need to include areas beyond our immediate Town of Chevy Chase. So in February 2009 we created a steering committee of likeminded, dedicated individuals from all five municipalities that

would comprise the organization at its outset. The committee met every three weeks until September 2009, when it was able to form Chevy Chase At Home as a legal entity and name the first CC@ H Board of Directors, with Naomi as President.

Naomi remained President for three formative years. She did not seek this position but accepted with grace and integrity our need for a leader to mediate among the multiple, sometimes conflicting notions about how to proceed. Naomi's boundless energy, enthusiasm and grit made the dream a reality. Her "generosity of spirit, joyful outlook on life" (to quote Fran Pitlick) and welcoming smile won our hearts. As Susan Kahn, one of the original steering committee and Board members, put it: "we all lost such a kind soul and leader and visionary and good person." The meeting spots and byways of our neighborhoods will be hauntingly empty without her.

And from Fran: Not only was Naomi head of our organization, she also chaired the committee to identify and develop access to services that older members might need and established a working CC@ H office as a central contact point. One of her most significant additional activities was to form a small working group to identify several organizations that could deliver quality home-care services to members.

But that wasn't all; she persuaded the Town of Chevy Chase to provide substantial start-up funds once we were incorporated. The Town Council also acted favorably upon her plea for benches at strategic locations in the Town, places for tired walkers to sit and relax for a few moments.

If asked, Naomi would tell you that her greatest achievement was her role in the founding and growth of Chevy Chase At Home. So many of us are pleased to see it grow and succeed, and most of all, help us continue to live in our homes. We agree - it has been a great achievement!






